The Council of the City of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio, met on Monday, May 14, 2018, at 7:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Centerville Municipal Building immediately following the State of the City address. There being no Communications, Citizens Comments or Officials Reports, the Mayor moved to the Consent Agenda.

Mayor Compton explained the Consent Agenda contained routine procedural and administrative matters the Council had discussed in Work Sessions. Mayor Compton read the following Consent Agenda item into the record:

A. Resolution 28-18, A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Centerville Participation In The ODOT Winter Contract (018-19) For Road Salt.

When Deputy Mayor Kenley questioned whether the Centerville Schools participated in the contract, Mr. Spitler answered in the affirmative. Mr. Beals asked how the road salt was delivered, how much salt the City is able to store and whether all of the communities in Ohio take part in this contract. Mr. Spitler responded salt deliveries are spaced out from September 1 through April 30 each year, before stating the capacity of the salt bin at Public Works is 2,400 tons and not all communities participate in the ODOT program. He added the City of Centerville used approximately 2,100 tons of road salt last year.

Mr. Beals sponsored the consent agenda and moved for its approval. Mrs. Rau seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously 7-0.

The Mayor adjourned the meeting at 7:40 P.M. The next regular meeting of the Centerville City Council was scheduled for Monday, May 21, 2018.
