

ORDINANCE NO. 22-19

CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER Mrs. Kenley ON THE 18th DAY OF November, 2019.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CENTERVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE, SECTION 1062.22 TO ALLOW ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE LEONARD E. STUBBS PARK & CENTERVILLE COMMUNITY AMPHITHEATER UPON APPROVAL OF CITY MANAGER.

WHEREAS, Chapter 1062 regulates the parks and recreation within the City of Centerville; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville currently prohibits alcohol in all of its parks; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville desires to allow alcoholic beverages in the Leonard E. Stubbs Memorial Park & Centerville Community Amphitheater for special events; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City to allow alcohol during these special events, but only in Stubbs Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the following amendments to Section 1062.22 of the Centerville Municipal Code is hereby enacted as follows with new language to be added in *italics* and text to be deleted in ~~strikeout~~ as provided in Section 5.02 of the Centerville Charter:

1062.22 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

No person shall bring into a park, or sell, give away or drink on park property, an intoxicating liquor or alcoholic beverages of any kind. *This ordinance shall not apply to the sale and drinking of intoxicating liquor or alcohol in the Leonard E. Stubbs Memorial Park & Centerville Community Amphitheater for events approved by the City Manager.*

Section 2: This Ordinance shall be effective from and after the earliest date allowed by law.
