ORDINANCE NO. 26-4

CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER <u>Sells</u> ON THE 19TH DAY OF <u>December</u>, 1994.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 11-91 LIMITING THE CITY'S PERS AND PPF "PICK-UP" TO ONLY CURRENTLY EMPLOYED FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES AND CERTAIN CURRENTLY EMPLOYED REGULAR PART-TIME EMPLOYEES.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the provisions of Ordinances 45-84, 2-85 and 17-85 which generally provide that the City will "pick-up" the employees' portion of the mandatory contributions to the Public Employees' Retirement System and the Police and Fire Disability and Pension Fund shall have no application to any regular part-time employee working twenty (20) hours a week or less who may be hired by the City after June 30, 1991 or to any seasonal employees as defined in Section II, LL of the City of Centerville personnel Rules and Regulations.

Section 2. That the provisions of Ordinances 45-84, 2-85 and 17-85 which generally provide that the City will "pick-up" the employees' portion of the mandatory contributions to the Public Employees' Retirement System and the Police and Fire Disability and Pension Fund shall have no application to any part-time or full-time employee offered employment and hired after January 1, 1995.

<u>Section 3.</u> This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure affecting the public health and safety and, therefore, shall become effective immediately upon passage. An emergency exists by virtue of the fact that recent benefit changes have been made by City Council for new employees.
