

ORDINANCE NO. 22-91
CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN Brooks Compton ON THE
18th DAY OF November, 1991.

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF A PORTION
OF WILMINGTON PIKE TO WHITES CORNER ROAD IN
THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 723.05, Ohio Revised Code,
in the opinion of the Council of the City of Centerville there is
good cause to realign a portion of Wilmington Pike, and

WHEREAS, the realignment of a portion of Wilmington
Pike necessitates changing the name of a portion of the existing
roadway to Whites Corner Road to avoid two roadways having the
same name in the City of Centerville, Ohio.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY
ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. That the portion of existing Wilmington
Pike beginning at the intersection of State Route 725
(Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road) and old Wilmington Pike (now
relocated east into Greene County), north along old Wilmington
Pike, also being along the Montgomery-Greene County Line
approximately 800 feet to a place where old Wilmington Pike has
been curved to the northeast to intersect the new relocated
Wilmington Pike in Greene County be hereby changed to Whites
Corner Road.

SECTION 2. That the Clerk of Council and City Engineer
are hereby authorized and directed to cause this name change to
become a matter of public record with the proper offices of
Montgomery County, Ohio.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall become effective from
and after the earliest date allowed by law.
