AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 505.09(a)
OF THE CENTERVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE
RELATING TO BARKING OR HOWLING DOGS.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 505.09(a) of the
Centerville Municipal Code shall be amended as follows with
deleted portions appearing in brackets and new portions
being underlined:

No person shall keep or harbor any dog within the
Municipality which, by frequent [and] or habitual
barking, howling or yelping, creates unreasonably
loud and disturbing noises of such a character,
intensity and duration as to disturb the peace,
quiet and good order of the Municipality. Any
person who shall allow any dog habitually to
remain, be lodged or fed within any dwelling,
building, yard or enclosure, which he occupies or
owns, shall be considered as harboring such dog.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall become effective
from and after the earliest date allowed by law.
