

ORDINANCE NO. 6-76

CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN Stovs ON THE 2nd DAY OF February, 1976.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 513, DRUG ABUSE CONTROL, OF THE CENTERVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE TO COMPLY WITH LEGISLATIVE CHANGES TO TITLE 37 OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Chapter 513 of the Centerville Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

[513.01 DRUG OF ABUSE DEFINED.

As used in the Municipal Code, "Drug of abuse" means any narcotic drug as defined in Ohio R.C. 3719.01, any barbiturate or amphetamine as defined in Ohio R.C. 3719.23, any hallucinogen as defined in Section 513.02, any harmful intoxicant as defined in Section 513.03 and any dangerous drug as defined in Ohio R.C. 4729.02. (ORC 3719.011(A))]

513.01 DEFINITIONS.

As used in this chapter, certain terms are defined as follows:

- (a) "Administer" means the direct application of a drug, whether by injection, inhalation, ingestion or any other means to a person or an animal.
- (b) "Controlled substance" means a drug, compound, mixture, preparation or substance included in Schedule I, II, III, IV or V.
- (c) "Dispense" means sell, leave with, give away, dispose of or deliver.
- (d) "Hypodermic" means a hypodermic syringe or needle, or other instrument or device for the subcutaneous injection of medication.
- (e) "Manufacturer" means a person who plants, cultivates, harvests, processes, makes, prepares or otherwise engages in any part of the production of a controlled substance by propagation, compounding, conversion or processing, either directly or indirectly by extraction and chemical synthesis and includes any packaging or repackaging of the substance or labeling or relabeling of its container and other activities incident to production, except that this term does not include a pharmacist who prepares, compounds, packages or labels a controlled substance as an incident to dispensing a controlled substance in accordance with a prescription and in the usual course of professional practice.
- (f) "Marihuana" means all parts of any plant of the genus cannabis, whether growing or not, the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds or resin. It does not include the mature stalks of the plant, fiber produced from the stalks, oils or cake made from the seeds of the plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt derivative, mixture or preparation of the mature stalks except the resin extracted therefrom, fiber, oil or cake, or the sterilized seed of the plant which is incapable of germinization.

- (g) "Official written order" means an order written on a form provided for that purpose by the Director of the United States Drug Enforcement Administration, under any laws of the United States making provision therefor, if such order forms are authorized and required by Federal law.
- (h) "Pharmacist" means a person registered with the State Board of Pharmacy as a compounder and dispenser of drugs.
- (i) "Pharmacy" means any area, room, rooms, place of business, department or portion of any of the foregoing, where prescriptions are filled or where drugs, dangerous drugs or poisons are compounded, sold, offered, or displayed for sale, dispensed or distributed to the public.
- (j) "Practitioner" means a person who is licensed pursuant to Ohio R.C. Chapter 4715, 4731 or 4741 and authorized by law to write prescriptions for drugs or dangerous drugs.
- (k) "Prescription" means a written or oral order for a controlled substance for the use of a particular person or a particular animal given by a practitioner in the course of professional practice and in accordance with the regulations promulgated by the Director of the United States Drug Enforcement Administration, pursuant to the Federal drug abuse control laws.
- (l) "Sale" includes delivery, barter, exchange, transfer or gift, or offer thereof, and each such transaction made by any person, whether as principal, proprietor, agent, servant or employee.
- (m) "Schedule I", "Schedule II", "Schedule III", "Schedule IV" and Schedule V" mean controlled substance Schedules I, II, III, IV, and V respectively, established pursuant to Ohio R.C. 3719.41, as amended pursuant to Ohio R.C. 3719.43 or 3719.44.
- (n) "Wholesaler" means a person who, on official written orders other than prescriptions, supplies controlled substances that he himself has not manufactured, produced or prepared and includes "wholesale distributor of dangerous drugs" as this term is defined in Ohio R.C. 4729.02. (ORC 3719.01)
- (o) "Drug of abuse" means any controlled substance as defined in subsection (b) hereof, any harmful intoxicant as defined in subsection (v) hereof and any dangerous drug as defined in subsection (p) hereof. (ORC 3719.011)
- (p) "Dangerous drug" means:
- (1) Any drug which, under the "Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act", Federal narcotic law, Ohio R.C. 3715.01 to 3715.72 or Chapter 3719, may be dispensed only upon a prescription;
 - (2) Any drug which contains a Schedule V narcotic drug and which is exempt from Ohio R.C. Chapter 3719 or to which such chapter does not apply;
 - (3) Any drug intended for administration by injection into the human body other than through a natural orifice of the human body. (ORC 4729.02)

- (q) "Bulk amount" of a controlled substance means any of the following:
- (1) An amount equal to or exceeding ten grams or twenty-five unit doses of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or which contains any amount of, a Schedule I opiate or opium derivative or cocaine;
 - (2) An amount equal to or exceeding ten grams of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or contains any amount of, raw or gum opium;
 - (3) An amount equal to or exceeding 200 grams of marihuana, or an amount equal to or exceeding ten grams of the resin contained in marihuana, or of any extraction or preparation of such resin, or equal to or exceeding two grams of such resin in a liquid concentrate, liquid extract or liquid distillate form;
 - (4) An amount equal to or exceeding thirty grams or ten unit doses of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or contains any amount of, a Schedule I hallucinogen other than tetrahydrocannabinol, lysergic acid diethylamide, lysergic acid amide or marihuana;
 - (5) An amount equal to or exceeding twenty grams or five times the maximum daily dose in the usual dose range specified in a Standard Pharmaceutical Reference Manual of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or contains any amount of, a Schedule II opiate or opium derivative;
 - (6) An amount equal to or exceeding one gram or ten unit doses of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or contains any amount of, lysergic acid diethylamide, lysergic acid amide or tetrahydrocannabinol;
 - (7) An amount equal to or exceeding five grams or ten unit doses of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or contains any amount of, phencyclidine;
 - (8) An amount equal to or exceeding 120 grams or thirty times the maximum daily dose in the usual dose range specified in a standard pharmaceutical reference manual of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or contains any amount of, a Schedule II stimulant or depressant substance, or a Schedule III or IV substance;
 - (9) An amount equal to or exceeding 250 milliliters or 250 grams of a compound, mixture, preparation or substance which is, or contains any amount of, a Schedule V substance.
- (r) "Unit dose" means an amount or unit of a compound, mixture or preparation containing a controlled substance, such amount or unit being separately identifiable and in such form as to indicate that it is the amount or unit by which the controlled substance is separately administered to or taken by an individual.
- (s) "Cultivate" includes planting, watering, fertilizing or tilling.
- (t) "Drug abuse offense" means any of the following:

- (1) A violation of Sections 513.02 to 513.08 of this chapter or Ohio R.C. 2925.02, 2925.03, 2925.11, 2925.12, 2925.13, 2925.21, 2925.22, 2925.23, 2925.31 or 2925.36;
- (2) A violation of an existing or former law of this or any other state or of the United States, substantially equivalent to any section listed in subsection (t)(1) hereof;
- (3) An offense under an existing or former law of this or any other state, or of the United States, of which planting, cultivating, harvesting, processing, making, manufacturing, producing, shipping, transporting, delivering, acquiring, possessing, storing, distributing, dispensing, selling, inducing another to use, administering to another, using or otherwise dealing with a controlled substance is an element;
- (4) A conspiracy or attempt to commit, or complicity in committing or attempting to commit any offense under subsection (t)(1), or (2) or (3) hereof.
- (u) "Felony drug abuse offense" means any drug abuse offense that would constitute a felony under the laws of this State except a violation of Ohio R.C. 2925.11.
- (v) "Harmful intoxicant" does not include beer or intoxicating liquor, but means any compound, mixture, preparation or substance the gas, fumes or vapor of which when inhaled can induce intoxication, excitement, giddiness, irrational behavior, depression, stupefaction, paralysis, unconsciousness, asphyxiation or other harmful physiological effects, and includes without limitation any of the following:
- (1) Any volatile organic solvent, plastic cement, model cement, fingernail polish remover, lacquer thinner, cleaning fluid, gasoline, and any other preparation containing a volatile organic solvent;
 - (2) Any aerosol propellant;
 - (3) Any fluoro-carbon refrigerant;
 - (4) Any anesthetic gas.
- (w) "Manufacture" means to plant, cultivate, harvest, process, make, prepare or otherwise engage in any part of the production of a drug by propagation, extraction, chemical synthesis or compounding, or any combination of the same, and includes packaging, repackaging, labeling and other activities incident to production.
- (x) "Possess" or "possession" means having control over a thing or substance but may not be inferred solely from mere access to the thing or substance through ownership or occupation of the premises upon which the thing or substance is found.
- (y) "Sample drug" means a drug or pharmaceutical preparation that would be hazardous to health or safety if used without supervision of a practitioner, or a drug of abuse, and that, at one time, had been placed in a container plainly marked as a sample by a manufacturer.

(z) "Standard Pharmaceutical Reference Manual" means the current edition, with cumulative changes if any, of any of the following reference works:

- (1) "The National Formulary";
- (2) "The United States Pharmacopeia", prepared by authority of the United States Pharmacopeial Convention, Inc.;
- (3) Such other standard references as approved by the State Board of Pharmacy. (ORC 2925.01)

[513.02 PURCHASE, USE OR POSSESSION OF HALLUCINOGEN OR MARIJUANA.

(a) As used in this section, "hallucinogen" means lysergic acid diethylamide, commonly known as LSD., N-N-dimethyltryptamine, commonly known as DMT., cannabis, commonly known as marijuana, hashish, ganja, or bhang, psilocybin, mescaline, peyote, bufotenin, epena, parica, ayahuasca, yage, caapi, amanita, muscaria and any other compound, mixture, preparation or substance which produces hallucinations or illusions when introduced into the body.

As used in this section, "cannabis" includes all parts of the plant cannabis sativa L., whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of such plant; every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of such plant, its seeds, or resin; and tetrahydrocannabinol; but does not include the mature stocks of such plant; fiber produced from such stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of such mature stocks except the resin extracted therefrom, fiber, oil or cake, or the sterilized seed of such plant which is incapable of germination. (ORC 3719.40)

(b) No person shall, with intent to produce hallucinations or illusions, purchase, use, possess or have under his control an hallucinogen. Possession or control of any hallucinogen specifically named in subsection (a) hereof constitutes prima-facie evidence of a violation of this section, except that this section does not apply to the use, possession or control of any hallucinogen by licensed manufacturers, wholesalers, pharmacists, owners of pharmacies, physicians and other persons, for research, clinical or medical purposes authorized by Federal law or any rules or regulations adopted pursuant thereto.

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree on a first offense.]

513.02 GIFT OF MARIHUANA.

(a) No person shall knowingly give or offer to make a gift of twenty grams or less of marihuana.

(b) Whoever violates this section is guilty of trafficking in marihuana, a minor misdemeanor for the first offense and a misdemeanor of the third degree for any subsequent offense. (ORC 2925.03)

[513.03 PURCHASE, USE OR POSSESSION OF HARMFUL INTOXICANT.

(a) Except for lawful research, clinical or medical purposes, no person, with intent to induce intoxication or similar physiological effects, shall purchase, possess, have under his control, use or administer to another any harmful intoxicant.

(b) As used in this section, "harmful intoxicant" does not include beer or intoxicating liquor, but means any compound, mixture, preparation or substance the gas, fumes or vapor of which when inhaled can induce intoxication, excitement, giddiness, irrational behavior, depression, stupefaction, paralysis, unconsciousness, asphyxiation or other harmful physiological effects, and includes without limitation the following:

- (1) Any volatile organic solvent or plastic cement, fingernail polish remover, lacquer thinner, cleaning fluid, gasoline or other preparation containing a volatile or organic solvent;
- (2) Any aerosol propellant;
- (3) Any fluorocarbon refrigerant;
- (4) Any anesthetic gas. (ORC 3719.50)

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree on a first offense.]

513.03 DRUG ABUSE; CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE POSSESSION OR USE.

(a) No person shall knowingly obtain, possess or use a controlled substance.

(b) This section does not apply to manufacturers, practitioners, pharmacists, owners of pharmacies and other persons whose conduct was in accordance with Ohio R.C. Chapters 3719, 4715, 4729, 4731 and 4741. This section does not apply to any person who obtained the controlled substance pursuant to a prescription issued by a practitioner, where the drug is in the original container in which it was dispensed to such person.

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of drug abuse:

- (1) If the drug involved is a compound, mixture, preparation or substance included in Schedule III, IV or V, drug abuse is a misdemeanor of the third degree, and if the offender has previously been convicted of a drug abuse offense, drug abuse is a misdemeanor of the second degree.
- (2) If the drug is marihuana and the amount is less than the bulk amount as defined in Section 513.01(q)(3), a drug abuse is a misdemeanor of the fourth degree, unless the amount of marihuana involved is less than 100 grams, the amount of marihuana resin or extraction or preparation of such resin, is less than five grams, and the amount of such resin in a liquid concentrate, liquid extract or liquid distillate form, is less than one gram, in which case drug abuse is a minor misdemeanor.

(d) Arrest or conviction for a minor misdemeanor violation of this section does not constitute a criminal record and need not be reported by the person so arrested or convicted in response to any inquiries about the person's criminal record, including any inquiries contained in any application

for employment, license or other right or privilege, or made in connection with the person's appearance as a witness. (ORC 2925.11)

[513.04 POSSESSION OF BARBITURATES OR AMPHETAMINES.

(a) No person shall possess a barbiturate or amphetamine unless such person obtained such drug on the prescription of a practitioner or in accordance with Ohio R.C. 3719.24 (A)(2) or from a person licensed by the laws of any state or the District of Columbia to prescribe or dispense barbiturates or amphetamines. (ORC 3719.24(D))

(b) This section does not apply to the classes of persons named in Ohio R.C. 3719.25.

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree on a first offense.]

513.04 POSSESSING DRUG ABUSE INSTRUMENTS.

(a) No person shall knowingly make, obtain, possess or use any instrument, article or thing whose customary and primary purpose is for the administration or use of a dangerous drug, other than marihuana, when the instrument involved is a hypodermic or syringe, whether or not of crude or extemporized manufacture or assembly, and the instrument, article or thing involved has been used by the offender to unlawfully administer or use a dangerous drug, other than marihuana, or to prepare a dangerous drug, other than marihuana, for unlawful administration or use.

(b) This section does not apply to manufacturers, practitioners, pharmacists, owners of pharmacies and other persons whose conduct was in accordance with Ohio R.C. Chapters 3719, 4715, 4729, 4731 and 4741.

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of possessing drug abuse instruments, a misdemeanor of the second degree. If the offender has previously been convicted of a drug abuse offense, violation of this section is a misdemeanor of the first degree. (ORC 2925.12)

[513.05 POSSESSION OF HYPODERMIC; EXCEPTIONS; CONTROL PRECAUTIONS.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) hereof, no person shall possess a hypodermic.

(b) Subsection (a) hereof does not prohibit the possession of a hypodermic by any of the following:

- (1) Any manufacturer or distributor of or dealer in, hypodermics or medication packaged in hypodermics, and any authorized agent or employee of such manufacturer, distributor or dealer, in the regular course of business;
- (2) A hospital, owner of a pharmacy or pharmacist, in the regular course of business;
- (3) Any practitioner, nurse or other person authorized to administer injections, in the regular course of his profession or employment;
- (4) Any person, when the hypodermic in his possession was lawfully obtained and is kept and used for the purpose of self-administration of insulin or other drug prescribed by a practitioner for the treatment of disease;

- (5) Any person whose use of a hypodermic is for legal research, clinical or medicinal purposes;
- (6) Any farmer, for the lawful administration of a drug to an animal.

(c) No manufacturer or distributor of, or dealer in, hypodermics or medication packaged in hypodermics, or their authorized agents or employees, and no owner of a pharmacy or pharmacist, shall display any hypodermic for sale. No person authorized to possess a hypodermic pursuant to subsection (b) hereof shall negligently fail to take reasonable precautions to prevent any hypodermic in his possession from theft or acquisition by any unauthorized person, or negligently discard a hypodermic without first having rendered it completely unusable for its original purpose.

(d) A pharmacist or person under the direct supervision of a pharmacist may furnish hypodermics to another without a prescription by a practitioner, but the pharmacist or person under his supervision shall require positive identification of each person to whom hypodermics are furnished, and shall keep a written record of each transaction, including the date, the type and quantity of the articles furnished, and the name, address and signature of the person to whom such articles are furnished. Such record shall be retained in the same manner as the exempt narcotics register. No pharmacist or person under his supervision shall fail to comply with this subsection in furnishing hypodermics.

(e) As used in this section, "hypodermic" means a hypodermic syringe or needle, or other instrument or device for the subcutaneous injection of medication. (ORC 3719.172)

(f) Whoever violates subsection (a) hereof is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree on a first offense. Whoever violates subsection (c) or (d) hereof is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree.]

513.05 PERMITTING DRUG ABUSE.

(a) No person, being the owner, operator or person in charge of a locomotive, watercraft, aircraft or other vehicles as defined in Ohio R.C. 4501.01(A), shall knowingly permit such vehicle to be used for commission of a felony drug abuse offense.

(b) No person, being the owner, lessee or occupant, or having custody, control or supervision of premises, or real estate, including vacant land, shall knowingly permit premises, or real estate, including vacant land, to be used for commission of a felony drug abuse offense by another person.

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of permitting drug abuse, a misdemeanor of the first degree, if the offender has not previously been convicted of a drug abuse offense.

(d) Vehicles used in violation of subsection (a) hereof shall be seized and forfeited to the Municipality, upon motion to the common pleas court. Forfeiture shall not apply to common carriers or innocent owners, nor shall they affect the rights of a holder of a valid lien. (ORC 2925.13)

[513.06 FURNISHING SAMPLES OF DRUGS OR PHARMACEUTICAL PREPARATIONS.

(a) No person shall furnish another a sample of any drug of abuse, or of any drug or pharmaceutical preparation which would be hazardous to health or safety if used without the supervision of a practitioner, unless all of the following apply:

- (1) The sample is furnished by a manufacturer, manufacturer's representative or wholesale dealer in pharmaceuticals to a practitioner, or is furnished by a practitioner to a patient for use as medication;
- (2) The drug is in the original container in which it was placed by the manufacturer, and such container is plainly marked as a sample;
- (3) Prior to its being furnished, the drug sample has been stored under the proper conditions to prevent its deterioration or contamination;
- (4) If the drug is of a type which deteriorates with time, the sample container is plainly marked with the date beyond which the drug sample is unsafe to use, and such date has not expired on the sample furnished. Compliance with the labeling requirements of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetics Act shall be deemed compliance with this section.

(b) No person shall negligently distribute, store or discard a sample of any drug of abuse or of any drug of pharmaceutical preparation which would be hazardous to health or safety if used without the supervision of a practitioner, in such a way that the drug sample may be acquired or used by any unauthorized person, or by any person, including a child, for whom it may present a health or safety hazard.

(c) The State Board of Pharmacy shall, pursuant to Ohio R.C. 119.01 to 119.13, inclusive, adopt regulations necessary to give effect to this section. (ORC 3719.81)

(d) Whoever violates subsection (a) hereof is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree on the first offense. Whoever violates subsection (b) hereof is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree.]

513.06 DECEPTION TO OBTAIN DANGEROUS DRUGS.

(a) No person, by deception as defined in Section 545.01 or Ohio R.C. 2913.01, shall procure the administration of, a prescription for, or the dispensing of, a dangerous drug, or possess an uncompleted preprinted prescription blank used for writing a prescription for a dangerous drug.

(b) Whoever violates this section is guilty of deception to obtain a dangerous drug, a misdemeanor of the first degree, if the offender has not previously been convicted of a drug abuse offense, and if the drug involved is marijuana or a compound, mixture, preparation or substance included in Schedule III, IV or V. (ORC 2925.22)

513.07 POSSESSING OR USING HARMFUL INTOXICANTS.

(a) Except for lawful research, clinical, medical, dental or veterinary purposes, no person, with purpose to induce intoxication or similar physiological effects, shall obtain, possess or use a harmful intoxicant.

(b) Whoever violates this section is guilty of abusing harmful intoxicants, a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If the offender has previously been convicted of a drug abuse offense, abusing harmful intoxicants is a misdemeanor of the first degree. (ORC 2925.31)

513.08 ILLEGALLY DISPENSING DRUG SAMPLES.

(a) No person shall knowingly furnish another a sample drug.

(b) Subsection (a) hereof does not apply to manufacturers, wholesalers, practitioners, pharmacists, owners of pharmacies and other persons whose conduct is in accordance with Ohio R.C. Chapters 3719, 4715, 4729, 4731 and 4741.

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of illegal dispensing of drug samples if the drug involved is marihuana or a compound, mixture, preparation or substance included in Schedule III, IV or V. For a first offense an offender is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, and if the offender has previously been convicted of a drug abuse offense, illegal dispensing of drug samples is a misdemeanor of the first degree. (ORC 2925.36)

513.09 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OR PRESCRIPTION LABELS.

(a) No person shall alter, deface or remove any label affixed by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacist or practitioner who dispenses a controlled substance in a package or container, as long as any of the original contents remain, except when lawfully filling a prescription. (ORC 3719.08)

(b) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, if the offender has not previously been convicted of a violation of this section, Ohio R.C. 3719.07 or 3719.08 or a drug abuse offense. (ORC 3719.99(C))

513.10 HYPODERMIC POSSESSION, DISPLAY AND DISPENSING.

(a) Possession of a hypodermic is authorized for:

- (1) Any manufacturer or distributor of, or dealer in, hypodermics or medication packaged in hypodermics, and any authorized agent or employee of such manufacturer, distributor or dealer, in the regular course of business;
- (2) A hospital, owner of a pharmacy or pharmacist in the regular course of business;
- (3) Any practitioner, nurse or other person authorized to administer injections, in the regular course of his profession or employment;
- (4) Any person, when the hypodermic in his possession was lawfully obtained and is kept and used for the purpose of self-administration of insulin or other drug prescribed by a practitioner for the treatment of disease;
- (5) Any person whose use of a hypodermic is for legal research, clinical or medicinal purposes;
- (6) Any farmer, for the lawful administration of a drug to an animal;
- (7) Any person whose use of a hypodermic is for lawful professional, mechanical, trade or craft purposes.

(b) No manufacturer or distributor of, or dealer in, hypodermics or medication packaged in hypodermics, or their

authorized agents or employees, and no owner of a pharmacy, or pharmacist, shall display any hypodermic for sale. No person authorized to possess a hypodermic pursuant to subsection (a) hereof shall negligently fail to take reasonable precautions to prevent any hypodermic in his possession from theft or acquisition by any authorized person, or negligently discard a hypodermic without first having rendered it completely unusable for its original purpose.

(c) A pharmacist or person under the direct supervision of a pharmacist may furnish hypodermics to another without a prescription by a practitioner, but the pharmacist or person under his supervision shall require positive identification of each person to whom hypodermics are furnished, and shall keep a written record of each transaction, including the date, the type and quantity of the articles furnished, and the name, address and signature of the person to whom such articles are furnished. Such record shall be retained in the same manner as the exempt narcotics register. No pharmacist or person under his supervision shall fail to comply with this subsection (c) in furnishing hypodermics. (ORC 3719.172)

(d) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree. If the offender has previously been convicted of a violation of this section, Ohio R.C. 3719.05, 3719.06, 3719.13, 3719.172(B) or (E), or 3719.31 or a drug abuse offense, a violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree. (ORC 3719.99(D))

513.11 EFFECTIVE DATE.


This chapter shall take effect on July 1, 1976. Any person charged with an offense committed prior to July 1, 1976, that is an offense under this chapter or Amended Substitute House Bill 300 shall be prosecuted under the law as it existed at the time the offense was committed but shall be sentenced according to the lesser penalties of this chapter or House Bill 300. Persons charged for an offense under existing law that would not be an offense under this chapter or House Bill 300 shall have the charge dismissed and his records expunged of all information concerning that offense.

513.99 PENALTY.

(EDITOR'S NOTE: See Section 501.99 for penalties applicable to any misdemeanor classification.)


Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall become effective immediately upon passage. An emergency affecting public health, safety and welfare is declared to exist by virtue of the fact that the drug abuse laws of the State of Ohio have been substantially amended and it is necessary for the City of Centerville to amend its ordinance on said subject in order for effective drug abuse control.
