ORDINANCE NO. <u>43-75</u>

CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE VACATING WYTHE PARISH FOR ITS ENTIRE LENGTH WITHIN THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section I. This Council finds that a Petition signed by the owners of all of the property abutting upon Wythe Parish in the City of Centerville, Ohio for its entire length has been presented to this Council, praying that said street for its entire length be vacated.

Section II. Council further finds that there is good cause for such vacation of said street as prayed for, that such vacation of said street will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made.

Section II. Wythe Parish for its entire length within the City of Centerville be and is the same is hereby vacated on the condition that the owners of property abutting thereon shall maintain same in the future and upon the condition that all existing easements for construction, maintenance and operation of various public utilities shall continue in full force and effect.

Section IV. The City Engineer is hereby instructed to prepare a vacation plat of said vacated street and the Clerk of Council is instructed to endorse upon such plat the action of this Council in vacating Wythe Parish for its entire length within the City of Centerville, Ohio and to cause said plat to be recorded in the office of the Recorder of Montgomery County.

Section V. This ordinance shall become effective at the earliest date allowed by law.
