
SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN Russell Sweetman ON THE  
17th DAY OF September, 1973.AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE  
NO. 11-66 AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE 29-70 BY  
CHANGING THE DEFINITION OF "JUNK CAR".

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:


Section 1. That Section 1. "Junk Car." as contained in Ordinance  
No. 11-66 amended by Ordinance 29-70, is hereby amended as follows:

"Junk Car. Junk Car is (a) any used car or motor vehicle not in the process of reconditioning, which has been abandoned for use as a motor vehicle on public highways [and] or which is in unsafe operating condition and shall have remained in such condition for a period in excess of [thirty (30)] five (5) days; or (b) is a motor vehicle impounded at any location off the public highway; or (c) is a motor vehicle being stored for service and repair; provided, however, that if said motor vehicle was impounded by order of the City Manager or anyone designated by him in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of Ordinance 29-70 or by order of the Chief of Police of Centerville, said motor vehicle shall not be considered a Junk Car."

Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall become effective immediately upon passage. An emergency affecting public welfare is hereby declared to exist by virtue of the proliferation of junk cars within the city and the necessity of having an effective means of removing the same.


