AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO APPOINT MEMBERS TO THE BOARD OF ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW AS ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE 80-71 AND TO ESTABLISH TERMS FOR SAID APPOINTEES.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION I.

In accordance with the terms of Ordinance 80-71 the Council hereby appoints the following members to serve on the Board of Architectural Review for the terms set forth opposite their names.

1. Elizabeth Hoy to serve for a term of three (3) years commencing April 17, 1972.
2. Fredrick Focke to serve for a term of three (3) years commencing April 17, 1972.
3. Joseph E. Ledbetter to serve for a term of two (2) years commencing April 17, 1972.
4. Howard B. Kreider to serve for a term of two (2) years commencing April 17, 1972.
5. Eugene F. Mayleben to serve for a term of one (1) year commencing April 17, 1972.

SECTION II.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and shall become effective immediately upon passage. A public emergency affecting the public welfare is hereby declared to exist by virtue of the fact that Ordinance No. 80-71 establishing the Board of Architectural Review is soon to become effective and the Board provided for in said Ordinance must be in existence at the time said Ordinance becomes effective in order that there may be no delay in the processing of applications provided for in said Ordinance.
