ORDINANCE NO. 31-72 CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN JOHN DAVIS ON THE 17th DAY OF APRIL, 1972.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 32 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF VILLAGE (NOW CITY) OF CENTERVILLE BY ADDING A DEFINITION SECTION.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Chapter 32 of the Code of Ordinances of Village (now City) of Centerville is hereby amended by the addition of the following section:

Section 32.1 - Definitions

As used in this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

- (1) "Intoxicating liquor" and "liquor" include all liquids and compounds containing more than three and two-tenths per cent of alcohol by weight which are fit to use for beverage purposes, from whatever source and by whatever process produced, by whatever name called and whether or not the same are medicated, proprietary, or patented. Such phrase includes alcohol and all solids and confections which contain any alcohol.
- (2) "Sale" and "sell" include exchange, barter, gift, offer for sale, sale, distribution and delivery of any kind, and the transfer of title or possession of beer and intoxicating liquor either by constructive or actual delivery by any means or devices whatever. Such terms do not include the mere solicitation of orders for beer or intoxicating liquor from the holders of permits issued by the department of liquor control authorizing the sale of the same, but no solicitor shall solicit any such orders until he has been registered with the department pursuant to section 4303.25 of the Revised Code.
- (3) "Vehicle" includes all means of transportation by land, by water, or by air, and everything made use of in any way for such transportation.
- (4) "Alcohol" means ethyl alcohol, whether rectified or diluted with water or not, whatever its origin may be, and includes synthetic ethyl alcohol. Such term excludes denatured alcohol and wood alcohol.
- (5) "Beer" includes all malt beverages containing one half of one per cent or more of alcohol by weight but not more than three and two-tenths per cent of alcohol by weight.
- (6) "Spirituous liquor" includes all intoxicating liquors containing more than twenty-one per cent of alcohol by volume.
- (7) "Sealed container" means any container having a capacity of not more than one hundred twenty-eight fluid ounces, the opening of which is closed to prevent the entrance of air.
 - (8) "Person" includes firms and corporations.
- (9) "Manufacture" includes all processes by which intoxicating liquor is produced, whether by distillation, rectifying, fortifying, blending, fermentation, brewing, or in any other manner.
- (10) "Manufacturer" means any person engaged in the business of manufacturing intoxicating liquor.

A public emergency effecting the public health, safety and welfare is hereby declared to exist by virtue of the fact that many sections of the present Chapter 32 of the Code of Ordinances are unenforcible for the lack of definitions.
