SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN LEONARD STUBBS ON THE 16TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1972.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF FRYMAN-KUCH CONTRACTORS, INC. FOR GENERAL CONTRACT WORK IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW CENTERVILLE MUNICIPAL BUILDING AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH SAID CONTRACTOR ON BEHALF OF THE CITY UPON THE POSTING OF THE PROPER PERFORMANCE BOND BY THE CONTRACTOR.

WHEREAS, the City advertised for bidders for the work of general contractor for the construction of a new Municipal Building for the City of Centerville, pursuant to specifications prepared by the City; and

WHEREAS, Fryman-Kuch Contractors, Inc. was the lowest and best bidder;

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The bid of Fryman-Kuch Contractors, Inc. to be the general contractor on the proposed new Municipal Building for the City of Centerville which bid was for a total of Three Hundred Thirty Thousand Three Hundred Eighty Four Dollars (\$330,384) for the base bid is hereby accepted and the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the construction work as set forth in said specifications in the form of contract set forth in said specifications upon the posting of the proper performance bond by said contractor in accordance with the said specification.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be effective from and after the earliest date allowed by law.
