ORDINANCE NO. 41-71  
CITY OF CENTERVILLE

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN John Zengel ON THE 7th DAY OF June, 1971.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 64.24 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE CONCERNING TRESPASSING UPON LANDS OR PREMISES OF ANOTHER AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 64.24 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Centerville is hereby amended as follows:

[Whoever, being about to enter unlawfully upon the lands or premises of another, is forbidden so to do by the owner or occupant, his agent or servant, or, being unlawfully upon the lands or premises of another, is notified to depart therefrom by the owner or occupant, his agent or servant, and thereafter enters upon such lands or premises or neglects or refuses to depart therefrom, shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$5.00. (RC SS 2909.21)]

No person shall enter without lawful authority upon the land or premises of another, or being upon the land or premises of another, upon being notified to depart therefrom by the owner or occupant, or the agent or servant of either, without lawful authority neglect or refuse to depart therefrom.

Whoever violates this section shall be fined not more than \$50.00 or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both. (RC SS 2909.21)

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective on the earliest date allowed by law.
