ORDINANCE NO. 43-71

CITY OF CENTERVILLE

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN Victor Green ON THE 7th DAY OF JUNE, 1971.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO EXTEND THE TERMS OF EXISTING MEMBERS OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE AS ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE NO. 25-69, FOR A PERIOD OF SIXTY DAYS.

WHEREAS, the terms of Harold Wells, Jr., John M. Butler and Marion Loemker, members of the Centerville Planning Commission expired on June 5, 1971; and

WHEREAS, the Council has not had sufficient time to consider applications to fill the expiring terms or to secure sufficient applications

NOW THEREFORE:

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The terms of Harold Wells, Jr., John M. Butler and Marion Loemker which expired on June 5, 1971 are hereby extended for a period of sixty days from the date of passage hereof.

Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance and shall become effective immediately upon its adoption. A public emergency affecting health, safety and the public welfare is hereby declared to exist because of the fact that the City Planning Commission is presently unable to function without a full membership and the appointment of a full membership to serve thereon at the earliest possible date is essential in order that cases now pending may be processed.
