ORDINANCE NO. 50-71 CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE "CODE OF ORDINANCES VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE" SECTION 38.4 BY PROVIDING THAT THE SHOOTING OF FIREARMS, AIR GUNS, AND BOWS AND ARROWS MAY BE PERMITTED BY COUNCIL WITHIN THE CITY.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 38.4 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Centerville is hereby amended as follows:

It shall be unlawful to discharge any cannon, pistol or other firearm of any kind whatsoever, or any air rifle, pellet gun, gas gun, BB gun or other similar object or any bow and arrow, crossbow or other similar object within the [Village] City. This section shall not prohibit the firing of a military salute or the firing of weapons by men of the nation's armed forces acting under military authority and shall not apply to law enforcement officers in the proper enforcement of the law, or to any person in the proper exercise of the right of defense[.] or to any person who has applied to and received special permission from the City Council to fire a cannon, pistol or other firearm, or air rifle, pellet gun, gas gun, BB gun or other similar object or any bow and arrow, crossbow or other similar object within the City.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date allowed by law.
