## ORDINANCE NO. 41-69

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO REQUEST CERTIFICATION OF THE CENTERVILLE BUILDING DIVISION.

WHEREAS, Section 7.04 of the Centerville Charter permits the City Manager to establish a temporary division by administrative order, and

WHEREAS, the City Manager has established the Centerville Building Division by administrative order, and

WHEREAS, Council feels it is in the best interest of the City to permanently establish said division and to request that said division be authorized to enforce the Ohio Building Code;

NOW, THEREFORE,

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Centerville Building Division heretofore established by administrative order is hereby established as a permanent division operating in the manner and form as established by the said administrative order.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized and directed to request certification to enforce the Ohio Building Code in accordance with Section 3781.10 (E) Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and shall become effective immediately upon its adoption. A public emergency affecting health, safety and the public welfare is hereby declared to exist because a building division has been established by administrative order but is only temporary and its permanent existence is essential.
