## ORDINANCE NO. 46-69

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 20.100 UNNECESSARY NOISES OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Section 20.100 of the Code of Ordinances, Village of Centerville is hereby amended as follows:

"It shall be unlawful to sound any signaling device except when reasonably necessary for the prevention of an accident. No person shall operate any motor vehicle, except when necessary for safe operation or in compliance with law, in such manner that the vehicle is so repidly accelerated or started from a stopped position that the exhaust system emits a loud cracking or chattering noise unusual to its normal operation, or the rubber tires of such vehicle squeal or leave tire marks on the roadway, commonly called 'peeling'."

Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and shall become effective immediately upon its adoption. A public emergency affecting health, safety and the public welfare is hereby declared to exist because there is presently no prohibition against the driving of a motor vehicle in a manner which will cause either a loud exhaust noise or the squealing of tires.
