Mrs. Wilder explained that the ordinance on the agenda prohibiting the outdoor feeding of animals will give the City an additional tool for handling individuals who leave food outdoors unattended to attract stray or wild animals. Staff has been working with the Montgomery County Animal Resource Center, and Mrs. Wilder reported that three additional residents have called to request traps for their properties after receiving the letters sent by the County before the program began. MCARC picked up 12 cats in one concentrated area. Mrs. Wilder noted that the City was continuing to look at the snip/clip/tip program as another possible measure. She pointed out she received a number of positive comments from the neighbors after the letters were sent.

Mr. Beals requested that Councilmembers fund a \$250 Hole Sponsorship at the 17th Annual Kalamon Golf Tournament and Pig Roast on Monday, September 8, 2014 at Yankee Trace. Council concurred to sponsor the hole at this year's tournament, as in the past.

Mayor Kingseed and Mr. Horn had met on this date with Mayor Don Patterson and City Manager Mark Schwieterman of Kettering regarding the Mayor's Court. Mr. Patterson and Mr. Schwieterman expressed concerns about Centerville reducing its use of the Kettering Municipal Court system.

Mr. Compton stated that Ms. Sargent had called him wanting to know what her Records Request had cost the City. Staff estimated that Mr. Liberman had reviewed 35,000 documents. The first request cost \$5,000-6,000, and the second records request cost the city approximately \$11,000 in legal fees. Staff time for both requests had not been calculated.
