

Mr. Horn outlined the proposed Capital Improvement Program for 2014-2018. He explained that once again this CIP is very conservative.

Mayor Kingseed asked Mrs. James to circulate dates for the 2014 Council Retreat and asked the Councilmembers to check their calendars.

Mr. Horn gave an update on House Bill 5. It has been voted out of the House Ways and Means Committee. State Representatives Peggy Lehner and Jim Butler have stated that they are going to vote against HB5. The City estimates \$800,000 in tax revenues could be lost. This amount is in addition to the recent State cuts in the Local Government Fund revenues and the elimination of the estate tax. HB5 is income tax reform, not just a means to achieve a more uniform income tax system. HB5 is now going to the Senate; if passed, municipalities will face additional major reductions in revenue.

The proposed Operating Budget will be on the Council Work Session Agenda on December 2, 2013.
