Mr. Horn brought up the following topics:

- Mini water crisis at the Golf Course
- A panel discussion on Wednesday, July 18, to discuss State Tax Uniformity.
 Two State Representatives, as well as several other city managers in this area, are expected to attend this meeting at the Dayton Cultural Center.
- Brush collection by the Public Works Department. By the end of this week, crews are hoping to complete the pickup of brush due to the wind storm that came through the area on June 29, 2012.

Mr. Spitler reported that most of the concrete work is completed on the Street Resurfacing Project for this year. Milling could start as early as this week, and resurfacing will follow.

Mayor Kingseed briefed Council on the proceedings for the Council Meeting following this Work Session.

The electric charging station was the next topic of discussion. Mr. Singer had spoken to Mr. Tarazano to let him know about the proposed electric vehicle charging station, because Mr. Tarazano had installed numerous solar panels on his roof. He told Mr. Singer that he hadn't paid an electric bill for six months. Mr. Horn explained that the City had received a grant award with Clean Fuels Ohio through the United States Department of Energy for an electric vehicle charging station. Authorization of the agreement for the award is an agenda item on the

following Council Meeting agenda. Mrs. Wilder said that organizing for the vehicle charging station and the grant is a learning process and that the City of Dublin is working on an electric vehicle charging station also. There are only a few charging stations in the southwest Ohio area. Signage will be installed on Franklin and Main Streets to guide citizens to the charging station behind Panera Bread Restaurant in the public parking lot. GPS navigation systems also will direct individuals to the locations. Mr. Singer suggested getting publicity out. Still being decided is whether to have a single or dual charging station in the APD District or to add a second location for one of the units.
