Discussion occurred with regard to Centerville's list of projects that may qualify for federal funds for the proposed Economic Stimulus Bill that the new Presidential administration is developing. The City has submitted two "Ready to go" energy infrastructure projects: 1) the new Public Works Facility and 2) the Centerville Station Reconstruction and Widening Project. Mr. Horn stated that transportation based programs and projects will be funneled through the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission. MVRPC is the MPO (Metropolitan Planning Organization) which will be the clearing house for federal funds. The above two projects will be shovel ready within six months. The City needs to be informed and stay abreast of the current status of the proposed Economic Stimulus Bill.

Mr. Horn reported that he was contacted by Mr. Howard Poston, Greene County Administrator, asking if the City had made a decision regarding the right-of-way for the proposed extension of Clyo Road. He asked if it was the intent of the City to move forward to release the roadway easement that the City holds which runs through the Dille property. Mr. Horn will follow up with a letter to Mr. Tiffany asking for clarification as to how the Clyo Road Extension Project will be funded and how Phase 2 Improvements will be funded as well. Mr. Pittman had met with Mayor Kingseed, Mr. Cline and Mr. Compton before Christmas; and Mr. Pittman assured them that he would put together a proposal which has yet to be received.

Council concurred that four councilmembers will be attending the National League of Cities Conference in Washington, D.C. March 14-18, 2009. The March regular Council Meeting will be rescheduled for Monday, March 23, 2009.
