which will allow the Ohio Department of Development and the Ohio Public Works Commission to proceed with the funding of economic stimulus projects. Mr. Cahall gave background on the following bills: HB 86—expediting the foreclosure process for abandoned properties, HB 3—imposing new requirements when the lowest bid is not accepted, SB26—giving income tax credits to non residents of municipalities, HB7 requiring public entities to meet the LEEDS Silver Standard of energy efficiency in construction, and SB109—exempting developers and home builders from paying property taxes prior to the sale of completed projects.

In Standing Committee Reports, Mrs. Kenley reported that the members of the Environmental Committee (Mr. Cline, Mr. Beals and Mrs. Kenley) have signed an agreement with the US EPA making the City of Centerville an ENERGY STAR Partner. In doing so, they have made a commitment to monitor municipal energy use. Dr. Gresham reminded everyone of the upcoming Bicycle Rodeo and of the ordinance requiring everyone under eighteen to wear a helmet. If there are financial difficulties prohibiting the purchase of helmets, people should call the Police Department. Mr. Beals stated that, in order to encourage recycling, the Environmental Committee was instrumental in creating a guide which explains which items are recyclable and which are not. The guide was sent to residents with a recent mailing of waste collection invoices. Mr. Cline stated that Centerville Reports will air a segment on recycling in the near future.

Deputy-Mayor Cline explained that the Consent Agenda contains procedural and administrative matters. Approval of these issues will be as a group with one motion being made. Deputy-Mayor Cline pointed out the appointments and reappointments at the end of the Consent Agenda and thanked those individuals for volunteering to serve the community.
