Mr. Horn reported that the BCI has informed the Police Department that they will not be accepting rolled fingerprints from outside agencies. Fingerprinting will have to be obtained through web-based software. The cost for the equipment is approximately \$3,000-\$4,000 and \$15.00-\$20.00 per set of prints processing fee. There would also be a maintenance fee of approximately \$400.00 per year for the software. After discussion Council concurred that this is a service the City should provide to citizens. It was suggested that an article would be placed in the Town Crier to inform the public that this service is available.

Mr. Horn gave an update on the Clyo Road/Spring Valley Road intersection. He and Mr. Gary Huff, Washington Township Administrator, have met with Mr. Steve Varmuza, a resident who is trying to help raise public awareness of the need for improving and signalizing the intersection at Clyo and Spring Valley Roads. The City is in support of this project, but it will take additional funds from the State and/or County to help move this effort forward. Mr. Varmuza is working closely with Montgomery County Commissioner Charles Curran and has had repeated contact with State Representative John White's office. Mr. Varmuza would like to present this potential project at the next Joint Entities Meeting, which is scheduled for July 31, 2006.

Mr. Horn announced that Dwight Miller, a Police Department employee passed away on Sunday, March 12, 2006. Funeral arrangements are pending.

Mrs. James gave a brief overview of the interview process for the Assistant to the Clerk position. She and Mrs. Yonak (Human Resources Manager) feel that Ms. Julie Weaver is the best candidate for the position. Council agreed to make an offer to Ms. Weaver and to bring her

in to meet Council at a future Work Session meeting.
