

Mr. Cline explained that Mayor Kingseed was out of town for medical tests.

Mr. Cline will speak on the issue of the Countywide 9-1-1 Dispatch System during the Council Meeting in the Mayor's Report. He will explain that Council will continue to study the issue and will remain open to any new information. Council does not believe that there is a strong argument that it would be in the best interest of Centerville or its residents at this time. Chief Walker will be at the Council Meeting to address questions. Mr. Horn will give a power point presentation explaining Council's concerns.

Mrs. Lienesch inquired about the recycling theft issue. There had been a report of a blue pickup truck stopping at the curb during the evening before trash pick-up and the driver pulling metal and aluminum out of residents' recycling containers. The Police are trying to stop this and it may be necessary to enact legislation to cover this practice, should it continue.

Mr. Miller explained that the Contractor for the pond dredging at Hole #8 at Yankee Trace is planning to begin pumping out the pond in early March. The cost is within the engineer's estimate. It should not have any effect on residents.
