Mr. Horn announced that the next Neighborhood Improvement Meeting will be held in late April or early May, 2005.

Mr. Horn explained that the owner of Primrose School, a proposed day care for the southwest corner at Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road and Wilmington Pike has filed an appeal against a decision rendered by the Planning Commission to deny a Variance for the number of parking spaces required. The Planning Commission plans to amend this section of the Zoning Ordinance to reduce the number of parking spaces required for a day care. However, it would be July before such an amendment could be effective. Mr. Cambria has asked that City Council look favorably upon granting this Variance so that ground can be broken and the school can be ready for fall registrations.

Following a brief discussion, Council concurred that Parcel 29 in Yankee Trace become an agenda item for the March 21, 2005, Council Meeting if no injunctions are in place.
