Mr. Cline moved that Council convene into Executive Session to discuss a personal matter. Mr. Corbin seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion. Mrs. Lienesch was not present at this time.

Brett Kottmann was interviewed for appointment as a member of the City Beautiful Commission.

Paul Heintz submitted an application for appointment to the Board of Tax Appeals, but was not interviewed.

Council concurred that both appointments be made.

Mrs. Lienesch entered the meeting at this time.

Mr. James advised that Dempsey Waste Systems did not submit a proposal for the City of Centerville collection and disposal of waste. He reviewed proposals received from Rumpke of Ohio, Inc., and Waste Management of Ohio, Inc. If the City continues with the service, the fee will need to be increased by \$2.50-\$3.00 per month. Mr. Horn reported that a survey will be conducted by Wright State University to receive opinions relative to the type of service desired. Questions to be asked during the survey will be reviewed by Council prior to the survey being conducted. If Privatizing the system, the fee could remain at the current \$15.00 per month for the next five years. There is no guarantee as to the fee in coming years if the City continues to provide the service. Pros and cons of both systems were discussed by Council. Numbers will be presented to Council upon completion of the survey.

Mr. Cline reviewed a legislative update he attended in Columbus relative to what the State of Ohio economically is going to do concerning the tax reform issue. He shared information relative to the 2006 Ohio Republican Primary for Governor between Ken Blackwell,

Betty Montgomery and Jim Petro.

Mr. Cline advised that the Joint Entities Committee has met twice looking at cost saving issues in providing public services; there has been good dialogue between the five entities; some good will come in 2006.
