The Council of the City of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio, met on Monday, May 16, 2005, at 8:00 P.M., in the Council Chambers of the Centerville Municipal Building. The Meeting was opened with an Invocation given by Pastor John Bradosky of the Epiphany Lutheran Church and City Chaplain, and the pledge of allegiance to the flag, with Mayor C. Mrs. Lienesch moved that the minutes of the foregoing meetings, as distributed be approved. Dr. Gresham seconded the motion. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

The Oath of Office was administered to Centerville Arts Commission members Linda J. Snyder and Robert Cahill.

Executive Director Kent Bristol, outlined projects and programs which are and have been performed by the Miami Valley Communications Council for the past several years. He explained CodeRED, an emergency notification system made available at a discounted price for members of MVCC to be used for missing persons and natural disasters. CodeRED combines Geographic Information Systems with high speed phone dialer with a data base of phone numbers. He outlined operations of Gov Tech composed of the City Managers from the eight member cities, who meet once per month to discuss cooperative issues.

Stephanie Yenn, Chairman for Relay for Life, with the Dayton Chamber of Commerce and John Alduino with the American Cancer Society, were present at this meeting to explain Relay for Life, an event to take place on July 15 and 16, 2005, at the Centerville High School. This is an 18 hour walk around the track, a campaign to raise money to help fight cancer. The event begins at

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6:00 P.M. on Friday and terminates at 12:00 P.M. on Saturday. Ms. Yenn explained how this event began in 1995. They are looking for sponsors and participating teams.

Mr. Horn introduced Angella Tapogna, Project Manager for the implementation of Create the Vision. She gave an overview of her life and work experiences.

Mayor Kingseed reported on the following events:

On Saturday, May 7, 2005, a Cricket field was dedicated in the Leonard E. Stubbs Memorial Park.

An update was given relative to ways the City is attempting to improve neighborhoods. The Montgomery & Greene County Mayors and Managers Association is currently working on an Ordinance to provide for rental inspections. A Neighborhood Relations Task Force is being formed made up of 3 members-at-large, 2 members of City Council and 2 members from the Centerville Property Review Commission. This Task Force will review property maintenance codes and will recommend changes as needed. Mayor Kingseed asked for volunteers to serve on this Task Force.

Mr. Horn reported the following during the City Manager's Report:

The City's Annual Report will be mailed to residents soon.

Appreciation was expressed to the City's Public Works Department for Clean-up Week.

The City Garage Sale was a success.

Youth in Government Day went well this year in the City of Centerville.

Lockwood, Jones & Beals has conducted a study relative to safety issues at the northeast corner of Main and Franklin Streets. Their conclusion was that the present condition is best; their report will be before City Council soon.

Mrs. Wilder outlined code violations and resolutions for the month of April, 2005, as well as the community calendar for the coming month.

Mr. Compton gave an update on the Create the Vision Implementation Committee. At a meeting held on May 11, 2005, reports were received from sub-committees.

Mayor Kingseed explained the Consent Agenda which contains procedural administrative matters. Approval of these issues will be as a group with one motion being made. He brought attention to the appointments and reappointment to be made by passage of the Consent Agenda. Mr. Corbin moved that the following Consent Agenda items be passed:
