Mr. Compton read a Proclamation designating the week of May 16 through May 22, 2004, as National Public Works Week in the City of Centerville. Mr. James gave a presentation highlighting services provided by Centerville Public Works employees and introduced some of them in attendance.

Dan Kien, 635 Depford Avenue, was present to give Council an update on the activities of the Multi-Use Trail Task Force. This Task Force came out of the Create the Vision process. Their vision is "Creating Community Connections". He reviewed their Mission Statement and outlined their Goals. Mr. Kien explained the draft of the Multi-Use Trail Destination and Corridor Map. Their next step is to hold community meetings to educate and update citizens on developing a plan. Mr. Kien asked for support from the City of Centerville to finalize and adopt a plan in the September/October time frame. In answer to a question of Mayor Kingseed, Mr. Murray advised that they are looking to the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission for some funding.

Members of Council made a presentation to Mr. Hoffman in appreciation of his many services to the City of Centerville and its residents.

Councilmember Susan Lienesch entered the meeting at this time.

Mayor Kingseed reported the following:

-The City continues to increase cooperation with Washington Township. A joint meeting has been scheduled for May 24, 2004, to go beyond some of the tone issues, to examine ways in which the two bodies can cooperate to save tax dollars, and to determine whether it would be useful for the City and the Township to enter into a joint economic development agreement.

- He will be featured on "Let's Talk Centerville" on May 26, 2004, on TV Channel 10, at which time citizens can call in with questions.

-Dr. Gresham read a Proclamation designating May 17-20, 2004, as Operation Clean Sweep in the City of Centerville.

-Mr. Singer brought attention to a News Release "Centerville To Host Memorial Day Service". This service will be held on Monday, May 31, 2004, at 9:00 A.M. at the Centerville police facility.

Mr. Horn announced the following during his City Manager's report:

-He reiterated the fine services Public Works employees do for the residents of Centerville.

-A group of residents from the entities in this area, are developing a community calendar on one web site.

-Administrators from the joint entities are attempting to bring The Moving Wall to the Centerville-Washington Township community on Veterans Day in 2005.

-To acknowledge the professional services of Norbert Hoffman, a reception in his honor will be held on June 8, 2004, at Benham's Grove, beginning at 4:00 P.M.

- He reviewed the Police Memorial Dedication held at the Centerville police facility on Monday, May 10, 2004, to memorialize three deceased Centerville Police Officers.
