Mayor Beals presented a Proclam 2003, as Centerville Noon Optimist Day	nation to President Jerry Stahley designating March 19 in recognition of the club's 35 <sup>th</sup> anniversary.

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Erik Collins was present at this meeting to define a Montgomery County countywide economic development initiative called the "Business First" program. This is a business expansion and retention program in order to retain business in the communities and to create future economic development. Mr. Collins explained the operations of the program and how it is conducted. He explained how, through Business First, businesses looking at relocating have been retained in Montgomery County. 19 Montgomery County communities have joined the Business First program and 474 companies have been interviewed countywide.

Mrs. McLaughlin announced the receipt of two letters of resignation, one from Centerville City School District Personnel Appeals Board member David Hall and one from Centerville Arts Commission member Judy Wenzler. Mr. Kingseed moved that the resignations of David Hall and Judy Wenzler be accepted, with regret. Mr. Cline seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

- Mayor Beals announced the following events which took place during the past month: Everyone was wished a Happy St. Patrick's Day.
- Mayor Beals corrected a statement made in her message printed in the Town Crier that the Centerville City School District Personnel Appeals Board had not met in 2002; they did meet in 2002.
- Appreciation was expressed to all Centerville residents who voted on February 25, 2003. Mayor Beals thanked those who supported her financially and personally, and to those who voted in her favor.
- The National League of Cities Annual Congressional City Conference was held in Washington, D.C., March 6-11, 2003. Attendees at this Conference had the opportunity to network with colleagues from other parts of the country. Mayor Beals advised that she is a NLC Board Member. Areas featured during the Conference were homeland security, early childhood education and dollars for transportation. While in Washington Mayor Beals, Mr. Horn and Dr. Gresham had the opportunity to visit Congressmen to discuss items of interest.

Dr. Gresham outlined some of the highlights of the NLC Conference which he attended and in which he was involved. He showed a video entitled "Why Early Childhood Matters".

- Mr. Horn reported the following during his City Manager's Report:
- At the Conference in Washington, Miami Valley had a coalition formed to lobby for transportation legislation. Mr. Horn outlined the activities of this group of which he was a member. It is hoped that, as a result, some dollars will come to the Dayton area.
- City crews have been very busy cleaning up after a long winter season and preparing for the summer months.
- The Golf Club at Yankee Trace opened for play on Saturday, March 15, 2003.
- Upon question of Dr. Gresham, Mr. Horn advised that Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road should be completed by July of this year.

Mr. Pozzuto outlined Ohio House Bills HB40 and HB87, and HR362 on the Federal level.

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Miss Gilleland outlined code violations and resolutions for the month of February, 2003, as well as the community calendar for the coming month.

### ORDINANCE NUMBER 09-03 ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT REZONING CENTERVILLE STORAGE INNS

Mr. Kingseed moved that Ordinance Number 09-03, An Ordinance Amending Ordinance Number 11-86 Dated July 21,1986, The Zoning Ordinance By Rezoning 0.109 Acres, More Or Less, From Centerville B-PD, Business-Planned Development To I-PD, Industrial-Planned Development, be set for Public Hearing on April 21, 2003. Mr. Cline seconded the motion. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

Mr. Cline gave an update on the Joint Long Range Comprehensive Plan for the City of Centerville and Washington Township. He announced the meeting scheduled for March 19, 2003 to be held at the Centerville High School at 7:00 P.M. for a presentation by Ronald Fleming, a Planner and President of the Townscape Institute of Cambridge, Massachusetts, to speak about the importance of the character of the physical environment in making communities of distinction. Mr. Cline also announced the meeting scheduled for Wednesday, April 23, 2003, in the South Unit of the High School for a public presentation on goal statements and goal strategies of the Create The Vision Committee. He encouraged the public to stay involved in this project.
