


Mr. Horn reviewed for Council a request received from the City of Mason asking for Centerville's financial support for continued lobbying efforts by Attorney Paul Tipps to represent Cities on annexation issues before the State Legislature. The City of Mason is asking several Cities throughout the State for a contribution of \$1,000.00 to defray some of the expenses. The majority of Council concurred to support the City of Mason in their request. Mayor Beals reviewed conversations she has had with Ohio Municipal League Executive Director Sue Cave relative to the timetable for annexation issues to be discussed.

Mr. Horn outlined a request received from the City of Dublin asking for Centerville's assistance to join them in their efforts to have the courts nullify the recent passage of House Bill 283. This bill severely restricts and limits Ohio Municipalities in their efforts to control and administer public rights-of-way within their boundaries. The City of Dublin will be pursuing assistance from other Cities throughout the State. Council concurred that the City of Centerville offer their support to the City of Dublin in this endeavor.

Mr. Horn reviewed a request from Head Golf Professional Patrick Bayley that the City purchase items he brought with him. Perhaps these items can be used in operations at The Golf Club at Yankee Trace. Mr. Horn suggested that an inventory be performed through an independent audit. The majority of Council concurred with Mr. Bayley's request, if these items can be purchased at cost and the procedure has the Municipal Attorney's approval.

Mr. Horn advised that the second phase of the exterior property maintenance survey will take place in the area south of Franklin Street, north of Spring Valley Road, east of State Route 48 and west of Johanna Drive/Clareridge Lane.
