Washington Township Fire Chief Randall Staley and Ken Parks were present at this meeting to review for Council statistics contained in activity reports for the last half of 1993 and the first half of 1994. Mr. Parks explained a computerized system which details statistics and tracks occurrences reported at the various fire stations. Discussion followed relative to response times relative to fire runs and EMS calls. Mr. Singer stressed the importance of publicizing response times for the residents of our community.

Michael and Irene Pekarek, 125 South Johanna Drive, outlined their proposal for a more interactive/pro-active, support role involving the citizens of Centerville and the Centerville Police Department. They proposed that, during publicized and announced hours, two police officers walk particular neighborhoods on a get acquainted "cop on the beat mission" with special attention being given to residents, teenagers and young people, thanking them for their good citizenship and soliciting their assistance to help keep their neighborhood good and crime free. Mr. Pekarek suggested that this procedure be done on a trial basis. This proposal will be further reviewed by the Chief of Police and the City Manager.

Mr. Jeff Nini, Manager of the Centerville Service Station for the Dayton Power and Light Company, outlined for Council service projects currently in process and completed in the City of Centerville. He gave an overview of gas installation at the Yankee Trace development. Mr. Nini briefly reviewed a proposed Ordinance to grant the Dayton Power and Light Company an electric franchise to supply electric service throughout the Centerville Community for a period of 25 years. This Ordinance is much like the Ordinance passed in 1969 for a 25 year period.

Mr. Gerald Woodley and Mr. Richard Witt, Woodley Development Company, Inc., reviewed for Council their request for the elimination of sidewalks on one side in their development known as South Metro, Section One. They propose the elimination of sidewalks on the west and north side of South Metro Drive. This

matter will be further reviewed by City Council with a determination being forwarded to Woodley Development Company.

Miss Gilleland outlined a recent survey conducted among City employees relative to Health Service proposals submitted by Community Mutual and Western Ohio. Discussion followed relative to the level of services offered and cost comparisons between the different insurance plans. This matter will be further reviewed when the full membership of City Council is present.
