Mr. Haverland reviewed a recommendation from Service Director Richard Bishop that the parcels be awarded individually to the low and best bidder in each case. He advised that the successful bidder has agreed to a split in parcel 11: the City will mow the northern part of the park, with Harlow's mowing approximately 14 acres fronting on West Spring Valley Road and Virginia Avenue, plus the west side of Virginia between the sidewalk and curb from West Spring Valley to the end, thus reducing the cost per mowing to \$435.00. The grass will be cut only when necessary and the City will only pay for the mowings performed. Mr. Haverland recommended that bids be awarded as follows:
