Mr. Dan Vulgamore, Manager of the Centerville Branch of the United States Post Office, was present at this meeting to review for Council expansion plans for postal service to the Centerville Nothing has been approved relative to the relocation of area. the Centerville Branch or the discontinued use of the present facility on Irongate Park Drive. He assured City Council that the present facility will remain in operation even if postal service is expanded in the future. It is his intent to improve community relationships and be more responsive to the needs of In order to achieve this, he has organized an the community. Advisory Council composed of six residents to meet monthly with him. A P.O. Box 591217 for the Advisory Council has been established. Mr. Vulgamore is pursuing the use of the previous Gold Circle Storeroom or the K Mart Storeroom for postal service expansion in lieu of constructing a new facility. An Open House will be held in mid July so that the public may see the facility on Irongate Park Drive and postal representatives will have the opportunity to answer questions and receive complaints from residents.

Mr. Horn outlined for Council a meeting he recently had with Greg Taylor, John G. Black Builders, relative to future plans for property he anticipates to develop on State Route 725 just outside the corporation limits of the City of Centerville.

Mr. James Dinneen, Director of the Montgomery County Solid Waste Management Department, was present at this meeting to give City Council an overview of the Montgomery County Solid Waste Management District H.B. 592 Plan. He outlined future requirements for the disposal of solid waste and how materials will be separated according to compostables, recycables and landfill materials. He asked for the City's endorsement of the Plan developed by the Montgomery County Solid Waste Management Policy Committee, preferably not later than 60 days from May 19, 1993. Mr. Horn reviewed for Council a meeting he recently had with representatives from Yankee Development relative to future plans for property they own in Washington Township.
