

Attorney Phil Herron, Bond Counsel Attorney Frederick Kiel and City Planner Alan Schwab were also present at this Meeting to answer questions of Council relative to the proposed extension of Cloy Road from Bigger Road east to Wilmington Pike as an assessment upon lots and lands owned by Society Bank, Far Hills Baptist Church, Joseph F. Rippe, B. P. Oil, property owners in Lexington Meadows and property owners in Nestle Creek. Mr. Schwab outlined this assessment process and explained how it differs from those executed by the City of Centerville in the past. The City's cost estimate for property owners in Lexington Meadows is \$65.54 per lot per year, and in Nestle Creek \$230.10 per lot per year over a 20 year period.

Following the Special Council Meeting held this date, Council reconvened into Council Finance Committee of the Whole to continue discussion concerning the Budget for 1993.
