RESOLUTION NUMBER 30-92 EDGE APPLICATION CLYO ROAD

Mr. Compton moved that Councilmember James Singer be excused from this Meeting. Mr. Kingseed seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Heintz advised that this Meeting was called in order to meet a deadline for the submittal of an Application for Economic Development Funds to the Board of County Commissioners, Montgomery County, for the extension of Clyo Road from Bigger Road east to Wilmington Pike in the City of Centerville.

Mr. Singer entered the Meeting at this time.

Mr. Singer placed emphasis on the economic development benefits of this Application for funding. Mr. Horn pointed out the fact that this project has a tremendous economic impact on our community; it helps from a traffic standpoint in terms of facilitating Bigger Road traffic to Interstate 675 and the connecting area; and it allows for a large expansion of commercial development in the immediate area along with impacting the existing businesses. Mr. Compton sponsored Resolution Number 30-92, A Resolution Authorizing And Directing The City Manager To Submit Application To Montgomery County For Economic Development Funds For The Purpose Of Extending Clyo Road From Its Present Terminus At Bigger Road In An Easterly Direction Approximately 4,083.34 Feet To Connect With Wilmington Pike In The City Of Centerville, Ohio, and moved that it be passed. Mrs. Beals seconded the motion. The motion passed by unanimous vote.


