The success of the Christmas Walk in the center of Centerville on Sunday, December 8, 1991 was briefly discussed by City Council. Approximately 800 to 900 people toured the Gerber House and Benham's Grove. Upon suggestion by Mr. Stone, Council concurred that the City purchase a corporate brick for each of Centerville's Sister Cities - Bad Zwischenahn and Waterloo.

Seniors, Inc. Long Range Plan for the construction of a stand alone Senior Citizen Center, and the formation of a Recreation District was discussed by Council. The majority of Council concurred that the City's position should be that if a senior center is built it must be the first step in the formation of a Recreation District. Seniors, Inc. Executive Director Jo Ann Ropp and President Don Becker will be asked to meet with City Council on January 6 or 13, 1992 to further discuss this matter.

Discussion followed relative to Centerville's response to the position Washington Township has taken concerning the question of annexation and the future of Centerville and Washington Township. Councilmembers will contribute comments to Mr. Compton for a letter of response to be sent to the Washington Township Trustees. This letter will be signed by Mayor Heintz and all members of Council.

The majority of Council concurred that some type of an award should be given to high school students - runners up and winners in State and National competition. A policy will be drafted by the City Manager and suitable plaques purchased.

Council concurred that a name for the Centerville Golf Course be discussed at a future Council Work Session Meeting at which time all members of Council are present.

Robert Perkins - Property Review Commission.
Council concurred that said reappointments be made if that is their intent.
