Dear Resident:

The City of Centerville is pleased to continue to expand our program for our recycle collection services. The City will provide a 64-gallon recycling container for no additional charge to residents who choose to participate. The recycling container is similar to the refuse container, but it is smaller and has a blue lid for easy identification. The new containers will be phased into service throughout the year.

**How will containers be distributed?**

- **If you currently recycle, you will receive a container within the next few weeks. Place your normal recycle container at the curb on your regular collection day and a new container will be provided. Repurpose your old recycling container or discard it into your current trash container. Please do not put your old recycle container into your new recycle container.**
- **If you do not currently recycle, you will not be provided a container unless you request one by calling Public Works at (937) 428-4782. The City of Centerville encourages all residents to recycle.**

A city crew member will place a recycle container at the curb in the **suggested location** for your weekly recycling pick-up. Waste and recycle containers should be placed on opposite sides of the driveway. If this is not possible, remember to keep a three-foot clearance around your containers. Please remember to have your waste and recycle materials out for collection by 7:00 a.m. on your normal day of collection, as pick-up times may vary with the new containers.

Please place all recycle materials loose into the container. Do not use plastic bags. Cardboard should be cut down to a manageable size and placed loosely into the container. Once container is full, flattened cardboard should be bundled and placed 3 feet from the recycle container.
