

Mr. Haverland provided Council with an update concerning Centerville's Recycling Program. With the discontinuance of the St Vincent's Recycling Program, various other alternatives are being considered. Centerville is committed to recycling and will continue to recycle. During the following two weeks recycables will be stored at the Montgomery County South Incinerator, to be picked up by Rumpke and a cost analysis be made. Centerville, Oakwood and the City of Dayton will go to bid on a joint venture to solicit a broker for our recycables.

Mr. Kenning briefly reviewed a proposed Agreement between the City of Centerville and the Miami Valley Emergency Management Authority. This organization has been formed to provide services of emergency management and civil defense for subdivisions in Montgomery and Greene Counties. Centerville's cost for this service is \$2,644.04.

Discussion followed relative to long range plans for the City of Centerville.

Mayor Heintz outlined for Council areas needing consideration in the Centerville Streetscape and Urban Design Project prepared by Pflum, Klausmeier & Gehrum Consultants, for the Architectural Preservation District: parking; east to west alley parallel with West Franklin Street; and boundaries for the core area and transition area. The majority of Council concurred that the City Staff develop some guidelines and criteria for the proposed change in boundaries in the Architectural Preservation District.
