Mr. Kenning advised that the ice skating rink in the Leonard E. Stubbs Memorial Park is ready for use when weather permits.

Mr. Kenning outlined two items needing clarification relative to the establishment of a Satellite Juvenile Court to serve the City of Centerville and Washington Township: fiscal agent and court location. These items will be further negotiated by City Manager Darryl Kenning and Washington Township Administrator Michael Morton.


Mr. Kenning reviewed a proposed Ordinance to provide that the cost of waste collection for commercial/industrial service be changed to \$5.00 and that it be adjusted periodically by approval of City Council. Following discussion, Council concurred that the proposed Ordinance be amended to include the increased cost for residential waste collection, a change from \$9.00 to \$12.50.

Mr. Kenning reviewed for Council a proposed Contract with the Combined Health District of Montgomery County to provide services for the City of Centerville relative to the rehabilitation of alcoholics and the prevention of alcoholism. This service is paid for by ten percent of the funds received from the State of Ohio for Liquor Permit Fees during the year 1990.

Mr. Kenning outlined the need to repeal Resolution Number 38-90 which accepted the Bid of Capitol Varsity Company for uniform rental for the Service Department. The repealing Resolution adopts the same Bid but now represents 33 employees rather than the 27 employees reflected in Resolution 38-90. The basic cost remains the same.

Mr. Kenning recommended that Ordinance Number 17-90 remain on the table; work continues to be done to make necessary changes to the Centerville Municipal Code.

Mr. Kenning briefly reviewed the financial legislation placed on the agenda for the Council Meeting following this Work Session.
