ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE NUMBER 16-90 HILLS REZONING

The Public Hearing was held concerning Ordinance Number 16-90, An Ordinance Amending Ordinance Number 11-86 Dated July 21, 1986, The Zoning Ordinance By Rezoning 4.768 Acres More Or Less, From Centerville R-PD Classification To Centerville R-lc Classification, And By Rezoning 4.866 Acres More Or Less From Centerville R-lc Classification To Centerville R-PD Classification.

Mr. Schwab reviewed this Rezoning Request filed by Hills Building and Construction Services and John G. Black Enterprises, Inc. for two parcels of land located east of Bigger Road and south of proposed Clyo Road and Thomas Paine Settlement. located the subject parcels on a map and outlined adjacent land uses and zone classifications. Mr. Schwab identified this as roughly an even swap of zone classifications. The Planning Commission, by unanimous vote, recommended approval of this zone change request to City Council.

Mr. Greg Taylor, John Black Enterprises, explained their

intent to cluster the multi-family development and to cluster the single-family development zone classifications.

Mr. John Koverman, Attorney for Hills, reviewed their intent to construct a clustered multi-family development consisting of 38 units.

Mr. Beasley reminded Mr. Koverman of the triangular shaped

parcel north of Clyo Road to be given to the City of Centerville. Mr. Schwab clarified the fact that the deeding of the parcel north of Clyo Road to the City of Centerville and the density set at 38 units per acre have been made conditions of approval prior to this Rezoning Request.

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Mrs. Beals sponsored Ordinance Number 16-90, An Ordinance Amending Ordinance Number 11-86 Dated July 21, 1986, The Zoning Ordinance By Rezoning 4.768 Acres More Or Less, From Centerville R-PD Classification To Centerville R-lc Classification, And By Rezoning 4.866 Acres More Or Less From Centerville R-lc Classification To Centerville R-PD Classification, and moved that it be passed. Mr. Stone seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

There being no further business, the Meeting was adjourned.
