Sister City Committee Applicant Cynthia Monter was interviewed by City Council. Council concurred that said appointment be made at the Council Meeting scheduled for February 20, 1989.

Mr. Kenning advised that a \$.23 per ton increase for waste disposal has passed the State Legislature.

Mr. Kenning advised that a Contract to Purchase has been executed for the western portion of the J. Milton Zimmerman property which borders the Leonard E. Stubbs Memorial Park.

Mr. Kenning advised Council that Library Director Cindy Klinck has extended an invitation to Council to tour the Woodbourne Library and to hold a Council Work Session in the facility. This will be coordinated by the City Manager and the Clerk of Council sometime during February.

City Council concurred that drainage improvements be made at the Jack Hicks residence, 121 Terrace Villa Drive, in accordance with Council Policy 987-1.


Discussion followed relative to a voice mail system in the Centerville Municipal Building, a system by which emergency questions may be answered during closed hours.
