Drug Counselor Carolyn Miller, School Board Member Tom Poulton, Superintendent Robert Kreiner from the Centerville City Schools and Police Chief William Lickert were present to discuss with Council the potential charge of a Juvenile Officer. item for discussion was prompted by a seminar attended by Councilman Brooks Compton during the National League of Cities Conference in December of 1988. This position would be a Centerville Police Officer working with Juveniles in our community. Dr. Kreiner pointed out the fact that times would require plain clothes and at other times a uniform would be appropriate. Dr. Kreiner has had experience with Juvenile Officers in other schools. Chief Lickert outlined what he would expect of this officer and the qualifications said person must possess. Mr. Kenning projected that said position could be in place by the beginning of the 1989-90 school year. Council concurred that the City Manager move forward with this proposal.

Members of the Committee for the Centerville City Schools Operating Levy were present to review their need with City Council. Mr. Don Kasle, Chairman of the Committee, asked Council to do whatever possible to promote passage of this levy. Mr. Wil Cahill stressed the need for additional money. Mr. Frank DePalma reviewed the school's financial status today and in the future. Mr. Richard Marshall asked Councilmembers to show support on an individual basis.

Mr. Kenning distributed to Council projected expenses as outlined by the American Festival Committee for the Festival this July 4th. Council concurred to contribute \$5,000.00 toward the Festival.

Mayor Heintz advised that a Joint Meeting between the Centerville City Council and the Washington Township Trustees will take place on Monday, March 27, 1989 in the Law Library. The agenda will be set by the City and the Township.

Upon question of Mayor Heintz, the majority of Council

concurred not to sponsor a Membership in the Dayton Chamber of Commerce.
