City Council interviewed City Beautiful Commission applicant Deborah Borger. Council concurred that this appointment take place at the next Council Meeting.

Miss Borger brought attention to the run down condition of some properties located in the Washington Park Plat (Plat at south east corner of State Route 48 and Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road.) Mr. Stone suggested that steps be taken now to prevent this area from becoming a slum area in the future. City Staff will review the situation and present a recommendation to Council.

Mr. Kenning announced Mayfest to be held the weekend of May 6, 1989 in the Architectural Preservation District, this is sponsored by the Merchants of Historic Centerville.

Mr. Kenning advised that additional space is needed by the State of Ohio License Bureau in anticipation of Title Operations being located in Centerville. The Centerville Police Department is also in need of storage space. Council concurred that the City Manager research for additional space perhaps in another location.

Mr. Kenning reviewed for Council his Meeting with St. Vincent's in order to establish a recycling center. St. Vincent's is acceptable to building and manning a structure if Centerville will supply the land; approximately two acres are needed. Council concurred that the City Manager continue to search for additional land.

Mr. Kenning reviewed correspondence received from Brian Stevens, Soccer Coach for Centerville High School, in reference to the future location for the War Memorial currently located at the Centerville High School Soccer Field. He is amenable to it being located in the Leonard E. Stubbs Memorial Park based upon certain conditions, one of which is the appointment of an oversight committee to organize, supervise and coordinate the relocation of the War Memorial. Council concurred that said

Committee be formed, that J. V. Stone represent Council, some other members being Mr. Tom Stolz, and representatives from Kiwanis and the Centerville VFW.

Mr. Kenning reviewed for Council the proposed future relationship between the City of Centerville and the Centerville Historical Society. Following discussion, the majority of Council concurred with said proposal.
