Mr. Kenning advised that the Wilmington Pike Task Force has requested that water detention and/or retention be included in the engineering study for the Wilmington Pike improvement. This is estimated to cost the City of Centerville an additional \$4,000.00.

Mayor Heintz updated Council on the Wilmington Pike Task Force Committee Meeting she attended this date. More statistics are being compiled for an alignment decision the later part of March, 1988. She has suggested an additional alternate "D" terminating Wilmington PIke at State Route 725, if a concurrence cannot be reached with another alternative.

Mayor Heintz reviewed for Council a Meeting she recently attended of the Solid Waste Advisory Committee relative to the Administrative Order filed involving the Cardington Road Sanitary Landfill site, during which a PRP Agreement was discussed.

Chief Lickert outlined innovative ideas and programs initiated by the Centerville Police Department. The department continues to hire the best people and to supply the best education. Chief Lickert reviewed the accreditation process and the City's status in achieving this recognition. The process will be completed by March 15, with accreditation coming July 7, 1988. Discussion followed concerning policies being established in the police department including physical fitness, exercise programs, etc.

Chief Lickert advised that the radio system in the police department is in place, small details are being worked out.

Mr. Kenning reviewed a memo prepared by Chief Lickert detailing problems being experienced with the filing system currently being installed in the police department. It has been determined that this system will not adequately satisfy the needs. The supplier of this system has offered to take back the system being installed and replace it with a Lektriever which will satisfy the needs in the police department; this adjustment will cost the City an additional \$7,524.05. Council concurred

that the necessary legislation be prepared to effect this change.
Chief Lickert reviewed the performance of the Volvo cruisers since their purchase and compared them with other vehicles operated by the police department.

Chief Lickert explained an Agreement currently being explored by area police departments referred to CANE (Combined Agencies against Narcotics Enforcement).

Mr. Kenning brought attention to a request received from several parents through the P.T.O. Board that additional lighting be provided at the entrance into the Centerville High School. The cost to the City of Centerville would be approximately \$300.00 to \$400.00 per year. Council concurred with this proposal.

Mayor Heintz briefed Council on a recent Meeting she attended concerning Washington Township's proposal to purchase the South Suburban YMCA facility. This matter will be further discussed during the Joint Meeting scheduled on March 10 between the Centerville City Council, Washington Township Trustees and the Centerville City Schools Board of Education.
