## CENTERVILLE CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION MEETING APRIL 20, 1987

Mr. King reviewed for Council a proposed Tactical Crime Suppression Unit Extension Agreement among the Miami Valley Cable Council and the Cities of Centerville, Kettering, Miamisburg, Moraine, Oakwood and West Carrollton. This Agreement will extend under the same terms and conditions as the initial Agreement until midnight, December 31, 1987.

Mr. King reviewed the recommendation of the City Engineer that the Sidewalk Bond posted on Pelbrook Farm, Section Five, be This residential development is fully developed according to City specifications.

Chief of Police William Lickert reviewed for Council the events which took place relative to an automobile accident and citation issued on April 11, 1987 involving a teenager. An internal investigation revealed that Police Department Policy had been followed by the arresting officer.

Mr. Compton reviewed the Long Range Plan developed by Seniors, Inc. Projections demonstrate 67% support from the two government entities (City and Township) and 33% from Seniors, Inc. membership over a five year period. Mayor Heintz outlined how Senior Centers are financed in other Municipalities located in Montgomery County. Discussion followed relative to the City's support for the Senior Citizen Center and to what extent that support should be extended. Council concurred that the City should support Seniors, Inc. Mr. Taylor pointed out the fact that the City's budget is reviewed annually, support for Seniors, Inc. should not exceed the statute of limitations established by Council - that no more than 7/10 of 1% of the total annual budget shall be allocated for social services. Council concurred to endorse Seniors, Inc. five year long range plan, they commit to the current year funding and will attempt to meet the five year figures included in the long range plan. City Council further points out the fact that the dity's budget is prepared on an annual basis, thus the City's support will be reviewed each year

and approved with the annual budget. This information will be relayed to Seniors, Inc. by Mayor Heintz.
