


Chief Lickert reviewed for Council his recommendation to Mr. Kenning that Volvo police cruisers again be purchased this year. He reviewed the performance record of those presently owned by the City of Centerville and the reception of these cruisers by the Police Officers. Discussion followed relative to the purchase of Volvos vs American made vehicles. The majority of Council concurred that the City advertise for bids for the purchase of additional Volvo police vehicles.

Copies of proposed changes to the Personnel Rules and Regulations for employees of the City of Centerville were made available to Council Members prior to this Meeting. These were compared with the Personnel Ordinances passed each year by City Council. Following discussion, it was the consensus of the majority of Council that this, a portion of the Administrative Code, not require Council action, this is an administrative matter and should not require legislative action. This will be further reviewed with Municipal Attorney Robert Farquhar for compliance with the Centerville Charter.

Mr. Bormet reviewed his proposal to proceed with the final engineering for the Spring Valley, State Route 49 Intersection

Improvement Project. The City has budgeted \$100,000 to proceed with this engineering in 1986. Upon suggestion of Mr. Taylor, Council concurred that costs and options for financing be reviewed prior to making a decision on this matter. City Council requested that an in-house ballpark estimate be drafted for the improvement to Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road from Loop Road to Clys Road in the City of Centerville.
