A Notice from the Ohio Department of Liquor Control of an Application for a new D5 Permit submitted by Smith & Mayberry, A Partnership, DBA Pogos, 101 Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road, was reviewed by Council; no objections were indicated.

Mr. Kenning advised that the State of Ohio License Bureau, located in the building to the rear of the Municipal Building, will be expanding to include title services.

Mayor Heintz advised that John G. Black Enterprises Inc. is again requesting the extension of the Subdividers Agreement for Thomas Paine Settlement Number Three from June 10, 1986 to December 10, 1986. Council concurred with this request.

Upon question of Mayor Heintz, Mr. Kenning advised that he is pursuing the clean-up of the northwest corner of Clyo Road and Centerville Station Road with the property owners.

Mr. Compton advised that he was in receipt of a Petition from residents in the Deer Run area requesting that the speed limit on Clyo Road be changed from 45 to 35 MPH. Discussion followed relative to the fact that authority to promulgate traffic control regulations is that of the City Manager. In consideration of the Petition filed, the majority of Council concurred that the speed limit be reverted to 35 MPH.

Mr. Singer advised that Mr. Thomas Stolz has requested that City Council tour the Leonard E. Stubbs Park during a future Council Work Session Meeting.
