Council continued with a review of a proposed Sign Ordinance for the City of Centerville. The following changes were requested by the majority of Council:

That the set back and height of signs in areas other than the AP District will be determined after Councilmembers have had the opportunity to view sample signs throughout Centerville.


The Ordinance be changed where necessary to provide that temporary signs for a 30 day period be approved by City Staff, signs for a period of time in excess of 30 days be approved by the Planning Commission.

The Ordinance provide that temporary signs in the AP District be approved by City Staff, permanent signs be approved by the Board of Architectural Review.

That all ground signs in the AP District be a maximum of six feet in height.

Political signs not be permitted in the right-of-way or on poles, but the amount permitted on ones property not be limited.

These changes will be made to the Ordinance and brought back for Council's concurrence.
