Mayor Stone suggested that appointments to the Planning Task Force be considered at a future Council Work Session Meeting.

Mayor Stone advised that, with the resignation of Assistant City Manager Joseph Minner, it is necessary for Council to appoint an Alternate Representative to the Transportation Coordinating Committee and to make a recommendation to the Cable TV Council for Joe's replacement on Cable TV Council, Board of Trustees. He suggested that City Engineer Karl Schab be appointed as Alternate Representative on the TCC and that City Manager Darryl Kenning be recommended for appointment to the Cable TV Council, Board of Trustees.

Mayor Stone reviewed the previous action taken by the City Planning Commission to terminate the City's Three Mile Jurisdiction into Washington Township. In order to complete this procedure, Council must repeal Resolution Number 38-73 to revoke the City's authority to review and approve plats of subdivision of land within three miles of the corporate limits of Centerville. The necessary legislation has been prepared and is an agenda item for the Council Meeting to follow.

Mr. Sweetman and Mr. Siler excused themselves from the Meeting at this time, due to a potential conflict of interest pertaining to the next agenda item.

Mr. Minner briefly reviewed the Site Plan proposed for MedFirst Physician Care, a facility to be located at the northeast corner of Franklin Street and Main Street. Discussion followed concerning the Plan proposed by the Developer vs. a Plan proposed by the City Staff.

Mr. Sweetman and Mr. Siler returned to the Meeting at this time.
