Council discussed the request of the City of Upper Arlington for financial assistance in their prevailing wage law case to be filed in the Ohio Supreme Court. In consideration of the benefit other Municipalities stand to receive in this case, Mayor Stone suggested that \$100.00 be used from the Contingency Fund for this purpose. Council concurred with Mayor Stone's suggestion.

Mayor Stone reviewed vacancies existing on the Community Fiscal Analysis Committee and asked for names of prospective appointees.

Mr. Kenning recommended and Council concurred that An Ordinance Amending Resolution Number 22-75, Resolution Number 23-75 And Ordinance Number 44-75, And Providing A Flood Damage Prevention Program For The City Of Centerville, Ohio, be tabled during the Regular Council Meeting to follow, in order that it can be fully reviewed during a Council Work Session Meeting.

As suggested by Mayor Stone, Council concurred to table Ordinance Number 12-81 following the Public Hearing to be held at the Council Meeting immediately following this Meeting. This is An Ordinance Amending Chapter 191 Of The Centerville Municipal Code To Require The Filing Of Income Tax Returns By Persons Not Required To Pay Any Tax Because Of A Tax Credit For Taxes Paid To Other Municipalities. It was determined to be in the best interest not to consider this Ordinance until after the Income Tax Issue is considered by the electorate on August 4.

Mayor Stone reviewed a request by the Washington Township Trustees for the City's Engineering Department to perform a drainage study in the area of Peachcreek in Washington Township. Mr. Kenning outlined time, cost and manhours required and the effect this would have on the City of Centerville. Discussion revealed the fact that the City perhaps should not perform outside engineering studies, the workload is great enough within the City itself, there exists the possibility of a conflict of interest, and some City projects could suffer. Council concurred that this request not be granted and the Trustees be so notified in writing, outlining all considerations.
