Council briefly discussed door-to-door solicitation in the City of Centerville. The Municipal Code for Centerville prohibits solicitors from going in and upon private residences to solicit orders for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise, services, magazines, periodicals and other articles or publications. According to State law, the City cannot prohibit charitable organizations from making door-to-door solicitations within the Community. In reference to the Williams Directory Company situation, they are asking for information only, they are not seeking orders for the sale of their Directory, thus their solicitation is legal under Centerville's Municipal Code regulations. Council concurred that information concerning door-to-door solicitation in the City be included in the next Town Crier.

Mr. Kenning briefed Council on a letter received from the Tactical Crime Suppression Unit Board of Directors to the Gov-Tech Committee for the Miami Valley Cable Council, relative to the continuation of T.C.S.U. The Cable Council unanimously recommended the continuation of the program with costs being shared equally by member Municipalities. Chief Randolph reviewed for Council, benefits that the City of Centerville has received over the past three years from T.C.S.U. This matter will be further reviewed during the Budget process for 1982.

Council was then briefed on the Police Department function and toured their facilities.
